Women's Auxiliary Report

3rd Quarter 2015

The year has raced by again and we are already over half way through 2015. As a result of family commitments and absence to escape the cold winter, our numbers have been severely depleted, leaving only two of us - Gladys and Angela - to keep up our work. Needless to say, our enthusiasm has not been diminished.

CONGRATULATIONS to Angela Docherty on receiving her 10 year Silver Service Badge for her dedicated service with the Women's Auxiliary, which was presented to her by our President Kevin Tucker last month.

RSL WOMEN'S COUNCIL PROJECT 2015 - This year the RSL Women's Council Project for 2015 is to furnish an apartment which is being built in Richmond by the RSL. These apartments will be used for any Veterans who, due to no fault of their own, have found themselves without a roof over their heads. This includes Veterans that have been in Ward 17 in the Repatriation Hospital when their stay has come to an end but have no appropriate or affordable accommodation to return to.

The units are for short term accommodation, the minimum time will be for six months, which will give the veteran time to find suitable long term housing for themselves.

To help with the fund raising the RSL Women's Council are running a raffle at \$1.00 per ticket to be drawn at our conference on the 4th August, 2015.

The First prize has been donated by Lakes Entrance RSL Women's Auxiliary, sponsored by their Sub-Branch, valued at \$1,400.00 for a 7 day holiday package with 6 cooked breakfasts and 7 dinner vouchers valued at \$25.00 each plus a \$200.00 Kmart voucher and two extra dinner vouchers at an RSL venue.

2nd prize value \$870.00 (\$500.00 Pre-Paid Visa Card, \$70.00 Big W voucher, 6 dinner vouchers at an RSL venue.

3rd Prize value \$600.00 (\$50.00 Wild Timor Coffee Hamper, children's table and chair set, with dinner set and table Mats, 6 dinner vouchers at an RSL venue.

One of those dinner vouchers has been donated by the Highett RSL, for which we are very grateful. The tickets are on sale now and we look forward to the usual generous support from members and quests.

Owing to our small number of committee members, we are always looking for more Women to join us, if anyone is interested, please come and see us. Meetings are at 7.00pm every second Monday of the month.

As usual, all profits from our activities go to local and national charities.
