

### 45 of the greatest moments in golf:

No. 45 Disabled golfer Casey Martin triggers a national debate on whether he should walk or ride

Casey Martin wanted to play on the PGA Tour, but despite a rare circulatory disorder (Klippel-Trenaunay-Weber Syndrome) that made walking 18 holes excruciating, the Tour wouldn't allow him to use a cart. If he took one wrong step, doctors warned, his atrophied right leg could snap. So in November 1997, Martin sued the Tour under the Americans with Disabilities Act, demanding the right to use a cart. A judge granted the 25-year-old a temporary ticket to ride, which he put to use at Qualifying School, securing a spot on the Nike Tour. In January 1998, with his trial looming and the world watching, Martin rode to victory at the season-opening Lakeland Classic, his first and only professional win. "It was intense," says Martin, who has conditional status on the Nationwide Tour in 2004. "Peter Jennings was there, ESPN, The Golf Channel. I wasn't on a mission. Things just came together. 



Proceedings then passed to Mr George Logan who spoke of the ANZAC spirit which followed with the Australian and New Zealand national anthem sung by Ms Georgia Lea. The flags already lowered were slowly raised as the last post sounded and the wreaths were laid.

Terry and his team in the kitchen put on a fantastic gun fire breakfast and the ladies of the Women's Auxiliary (plus a few of the bar staff) rationed out the coffee, some with a little rum I believe. At around 11am the 2UP commenced under the oculus in the sports bar, special mention should be made to Kenny Russell and committee member Wayne McDonnell who called most of the games and took considerable time regaining their voices in the days after.

Many of those not playing 2UP found a seat and dug in for the clash between Essendon and Collingwood on the big screen. As the last post played before the bounce every member and guest stood for a minute silence with all those thousands at the G.

Throughout the day many people ventured in to have a drink with friends, have a go at 2UP, buy a badge or just simply made a donation in the ANZAC appeals box.

### The Battle of Fromelles

The worst 24 hours in Australian history occurred 100 years ago at Fromelles on 19<sup>th</sup> of July (1916). Not the worst in Australian military history, the worst 24 hours in Australia's entire history. The Australians suffered 5,533 casualties in one night. It was a staggering disaster.

Fromelles was the first major battle fought by Australian troops on the western front. Directed against a strong German position known as Sugar Loaf salient, the attack was intended primarily as a feint to draw German troops away from the Somme offensive then being pursed further to the south. A seven-hour preparatory bombardment deprived the attack of any hope of surprise, &ultimately proved ineffective in subduing the well-entrenched defenders.

When the troops of the 5<sup>th</sup> Australian &61<sup>st</sup> British Divisions attacked at 6pm, they suffered heavily at the hands of German machine-gunners.

Members, their families, friends and guests all gathered outside the RSL; stand silently as the Last Post is played on ANZAC Day 2016.

Small parts of the German trenches were held by the 8<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> Australian Brigades, but, devoid of flanking support & subject to fierce counter-attacks, they were forced to withdraw. By 8am the next day the battle was over. The attack was a complete failure as the Germans realised within a few hours it was merely a feint. It therefore had no impact whatsoever upon the progress of the Somme offensive.

The Australians toll at Fromelles was equivalent to the total Australian casualties in the Boer war, Korean War &Vietnam War put together.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> of July, 2016, at Fromelles (Pheasant Wood) Military Ceremony the Highett RSL was represented by several of our members & their families who lost relatives in those horrific 24-hours.

### **NEW Function Room**


