Address from our President

The Highett RSL Sub Branch has had another very successful year. Our staff, committee and members should hold their heads high in their unyielding support to our Sub Branch. I will take this opportunity to express the Committee's thanks to our Club Manager Daryl and his Team of fantastic bar and office staff and also to Terry and his Bistro team. They are the front line of our Club whom without we could not have had such a great year.

During the past few months our welfare support, processes and the Little House Centre next door have been significantly improved. Roger Hyde and Jim Dale and the rest of the team are to be commended on the level of advice, support and information now being provided.

Our Sub Branch Veterans lunches continue to have great turn outs and I hope this continues into the future. It is great to see our Veteran community getting to know each other and having a laugh amongst mates, which last year included attendance and impromptu talk by Normie Rowe. The next lunch is planned for Mon 15 April, in the lead up to ANZAC Day commemorations.

In further support of our Veterans all Service members on their 80th birthday will have their future membership fees covered by the Sub branch.

We have also endeavoured to re-invigorate our list of Volunteers and the ways of raising funds for the RSL. An example of this was Roger and his band of volunteers spending most of the Melbourne Cup week at Bunnings in Mentone manning the sausage stand from dawn to dusk. To some a nightmare in the making but to our volunteers it was just another day at the office. I would like to publicly thank Bunnings Mentone for allowing us to use their facilities which raised more than \$3,300 and have culminated in the raising of \$34,739 for our ANZAC and Poppy appeals for 2018. We have started planning for this year BUT we need more volunteers. This is where you, the members, are needed to assist. If you can give an hour or two of your time over the collection period, please let us know. Drop in and let Roger or Jim at the little house, or Christine in the office, know that you can.

You may have noticed that the next phase of the Clubs renovations started. This renovation will install the lift to allow the full operation of our upstairs function room and give the front of the RSL a face lift. Please bear with us as we complete these renovations over the coming months. Also note that the main carpet will be replaced under an insurance claim and may also create some minor issues and movement restrictions at some point.

ANZAC Day is also nearly upon us and we will need to make some adjustments due to the renovations however our ANZAC day service and gun fire breakfast will still go ahead.

We are also looking at creating a dedicated Highett RSL Sub Branch Memorial to the front area of the Little House in the area currently occupied by our field guns. ANZAC House have given their support and committee member Mark Sutherland is managing the project. We are hoping it will be completed in time for Remembrance Day this year but it will be dependent on council approvals and funding grants or allocations.

Our Sub Branch is in a very good position financially and functionally and we, the committee and staff, will strive to ensure that our future endeavours advance the Sub Branch reputation and sustainability.

Welcome to the first edition of The Advance for 2019. The new year that has already presented the sub-branch with several new challenges with a slow trading 2 months, however still producing a profit. This has reduced from last year; however, it is a result of several factors not the least being the extreme weather conditions, the ongoing installation of our long-awaited lift and our facade and entrance upgrade. These renovations are all due for completion in the coming months.

For those of you who didn't attend the AGM on March 2nd, it was reported that our sub Branch had a profit in excess of 300k for the year 2018 with improvements in bar and Gaming revenue. Christine in membership has had her work cut out doing a fantastic job I might add. Since November our membership is growing at a massive rate, in fact faster than 95% of the RSL network. Growing from 1100 members in 2012 to currently 2780, with a projected target of 3000 this year.

A great result considering the fact that businesses typically lose 20% of their business every year, hence the importance to maintain memberships and gain new members. On that note, we will challenge you to introduce a friend and get them to decide to join as a new member - we will then give you 1,000 points on your members card. At the AGM I also announced the future fund which is a preserved fund allowing us to be perfectly situated to continue with the changing gaming world in 2022 with new 2x10 year licences the envy of many clubs.

The results for the 2018 calendar year were fantastic to say the least, with everyone playing their role in contributing. A big thank you to all staff, especially Gavin for looking after the numbers with our accountant Janice, good work! A special thanks to you, our loyal members, who keep turning up and contribute. We want your club to be the first-choice venue for our preferred member, YOU!

Don't forget to keep up to date with what's going on with the Phone App, Website, Facebook and the 2 new "What's on" TV screens located in the venue.

As I mentioned earlier the renovations are continuing for a while yet. They will cause a disruption and a degree of inconvenience with a temporary entry, and unfortunately this will still be occurring over ANZAC Day, but it will not stop us!



ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION

25th APRIL 2019

ANZAC DAY 2019

ANZAC Day goes beyond the anniversary of the landing on Gallipoli in 1915. It is a day on which we remember all Australians who served and died in war and on operational service. The spirit of Anzac, with its qualities of courage, mateship, and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of national identity.

On the 25th of April we encourage members and their family/friends to join the commemorative march to remember those who served in the defence of Australia, especially remembering those who paid the supreme sacrifice or otherwise suffered as a result of their service.

5:45am – The March

Form at the Henry St end of Station Street (corner Highett Rd) and then proceed / march to the entrance of the RSL 'Little House'. All members and guests are encouraged to join.

6am – Dawn Service Ceremony

- Rev Roger Featherstone leads us in prayer
- Laying of the wreaths
- Ode to the Fallen
- Last Post sounds
- One Minute's Silence
- Lest We Forget
- Rouse sounded
- Australian National Anthem
- New Zealand National Anthem

6:30am – Gunfire breakfast

Join us in the venue for a fully cooked breakfast prepared by Head Chef Terry and his team in the kitchen. We will also be serving coffee with complementary rum ration nip.

8am – Bar Opens

Enjoy a cold beer with friends or check the odds on the AFL through the TAB

10am to 2.30pm – 2UP

2up is a straight forward game held under the oculus in the main bar during the course of ANZAC Day. The spinner (person who tosses the coins) places two pennies on the kip (the wooden paddle) and tosses them. The pennies must spin at least two metres over the spinners' head and not come into contact with an object or a person. It must also land in the boundary of the ring. Players bet on either two heads or two tails. The ringkeeper selects the spinner and controls the conduct of the game.

12pm – Bistro Opens

3:20pm – AFL ANZAC Day Clash

The Anzac Day blockbuster between Collingwood and Essendon has been an ANZAC day tradition since 1995 and is one of our biggest national sporting events. The Anzac Day match pays tribute to the sacrifice of the servicemen and women of Australia and celebrates the Anzac spirit of courage, sacrifice, endurance and mateship. The match will be shown in the venue on all available TV's plus TAB betting facilities are available from 10am.

ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION

25th APRIL 2019

2 Up - Origin & Rules

Thought to have originated in the 18th century, the Australian tradition was born during WW1 when two-up – which evolved from the English game of “pitch and toss” – was played in troop ships and the trenches. But considering we only play it once a year, we understand you might be a bit rusty on the details. In light of this here’s a simplified how-to guide on playing 2up:

- 1) A person is selected as the “spinner” (generally greeted to loud calls of “Come in spinner!” by the rest of the players).
- 2) The “Spinner”, who tosses the pennies on the “kip”, is required to place a bet before their first throw, which must be covered equally by another player.
- 3) Side bets are also placed amongst the spectators on the outcome of each toss; irrespective of the spinner losing.
- 4) The spinner will then toss the coins in the air using the “kip” until they win or lose. Two heads means the spinner wins, two tails means the spinner loses and odds means the spinner throws again.
- 5) Celebrate your win. Commiserate your loss. Gamble responsibly.

2 Up - Fast Facts

- Mathematically 2up offers the best odds because the house doesn’t take a cut.
- There is the same likelihood of ten heads in a row as there is of H,T,H,T,H,T,H,T,H,T-about 1 in 1000.
- The chance of winning five hands in a row is 3.125%.
- For eight it’s 0.39%, for 10 it’s 0.1% & 20 it’s 0.0001%.
- The chance of five splits in a row is 3.125%.
- The odds of having exactly 500 heads and 500 tails after 1000 throws are 1 in 40.
- Three heads or three tails – 1 in 8.

Highett RSL 2019 Footy Tipping Competition

OFFICIAL RULES



- Entry:** Cost of entry is \$20. To be paid in full by 7pm round 2 (Thursday 28th of March, 2019). Any tipster who has not paid in full at this time will be considered no longer in the tipping competition.
- Eligibility:** The tipping competition is open to all financial members of the Highett RSL. Strictly 1 Entry per membership only!
- Tipping:** Tips for each round must be returned to the bar or via email no later than before the commencement of the first game of the round.
- No Tip:** Tipsters that fail to have their tips in on time will be given a score equal to that of the lowest tipster for that round. No tips will be accepted after the commencement of the first game each round – no exceptions
- Draws:** Drawn games shall be deemed as a loss and no score will be given for that game, unless someone is foolish enough to tip a draw. In that case they shall be awarded a point for a draw.
- Blind:** Individual scores will be posted on the score sheet only up to round 12. At the end of season all round from 12 onwards will be unveiled during the Brownlow Night presentation.
- Ties:** In the event of any ties, prizes shall be added and divided. For example, if two people tie for first, first and second prize will be added together and equally divided by the winners. The third prize will go to the next runner up.
- Pick 9:** Any tipster that correctly picks 9 winners in any one round, without anyone else doing the same will win \$100 in points added to their membership card. To win the tips 9 prize you must be the only tipster to tip 9 in that round.
- Certainty:** You must pick one team each round that you are certain will win. If your certainty fails to win you are out of this part of the competition. The person that makes it the furthest through the home and away season without failing to pick a certainty will be deemed to be the winner. If remaining certainty tipsters are knocked out in the same round and there is no single winner, the prize will not be awarded. The prize for pick the certainty is \$100 in points added to your membership card. Your certainty team selection must vary from week to week. No team can be selected as your certainty 2 weeks in a row.
- Tip the Grand Final Winner** The Highett RSL will award a prize of \$200 in points on your membership card if you are able to correctly select the Grand Final 2019 winner and have the closest Margin. Selection of the Grand Final winner must be submitted by the commencement of Round 4 (Thursday 11th April 2019)
- Prize Money:** The Highett RSL will contribute an initial \$1000 to the prize pool. Tipster entrant money will then be added to the prize pool.
- Initial Prize Pool before contributions from Tipsters is:
- 1st Prize - \$500
 - 2nd Prize - \$350
 - 3rd Prize - \$150
- Contributions from entry fees will be balanced across the initial pool in the same ratio:
- 1st Prize - \$500 + 50% of Entry Money
 - 2nd Prize - \$350 + 35% of Entry Money
 - 3rd Prize - \$150 + 15% of Entry Money
- Brownlow Night:** The tipsters prize presentation night will be held on Brownlow Medal Night with a Beverage and Food package included at no additional cost. Details will be confirmed closer to the date.
